A year with 'awe'

Ever thought about awe inspiring moments or places? I used to call them magical moments or magical places, until I learned that the emotion connected with such special moments or places actual is called 'awe' and that there are scientific studies around which try to grasp the concept of the feeling of 'awe'. So, what is awe? Here is a definition I found online: "Awe is the feeling we get in the presence of something vast that challenges our understanding of the world, like looking up at millions of stars in the night sky or marveling at the birth of a child. When people feel awe, they may use other words to describe the experience, such as wonder, amazement, surprise, or transcendence. The most common sources of awe are other people and nature, but awe can be elicited by many other experiences as well, such as music, art or architecture, religious experiences, the supernatural, or even one's own accomplishments."

I think of Christmas Eve in our church – the moment when the church is completely dark, and then the light of the Christ Candle slowly spreads out into the sanctuary, and illuminates the church with a golden glow. Then the chimes play the first notes of 'Silent Night' until everyone joins in and voices combine their harmonious colours. I think of a lush summer night in Jerusalem when the bells of the Church of the Redeemer ring full force and, at the same time, the voice of the Muezzin calls Islamic believers to their evening prayer. I think of a crisp winter night in Saskatchewan when I saw the Northern Lights for the first-time dancing in the night sky. I'm sure you can name a few 'awe'-inspired moments in your life as well.

Did you know that awe is an often-used concept in the bible? The word translated is not always awe itself, but it is apparent that awe is a thread which runs through the entire Biblical narrative. For example, there are references not only to awe but to amazing, astonish, reverence, and wonder. Related words such as fear, afraid and tremble are also frequently mentioned in the bible, and sometimes but not always – refer to awe experiences. Moreover, many references to the emotion of awe play a central role in religious and spiritual experience, often appearing in some of the most significant stories in the bible. For instance, after Jesus rebuked the wind, the disciples were described as being in 'fear and amazement'. The women who found the tomb empty were described as 'trembling and bewildered'. Those first filled with the Holy Spirit were described as being 'amazed and perplexed'. Saul's companions were 'speechless' when Jesus appeared, and it would be fair to say that Paul's conversion of Christianity involved being awestruck.

For me the feeling of 'awe' simply occurs when heaven and earth touch; when we get a glimpse of the Holy. Often, it doesn't need grandeur, just some openness and spiritual sensitivity. It is often something that we don't create, it is just there all of a sudden and usually fills oneself with warmth and joy, and when others are with us — a sense of community. I like that although I'm just a tiny, perishing piece in the universe, I'm part of something greater, unfathomable. Researchers are now even uncovering the benefits of awe for clear thinking, good health, and close relationships. I think that awe is an awesome feeling.
