Question: What does it mean to be an "Evangelical Lutheran Church??"

To be "evangelical" means to bring "Good News" as it is expressed in the Greek word euangelio: eu = good, angelion = I bring news, also meaning angel or messenger, and to be "Lutheran" means to be guided by the Lutheran Confessions as they come to us in the "Book of Concord, The Confessions of the Lutheran Church". Thus, The Evangelical Lutheran Church is a Christian community that practices or lives out the Good News of Jesus Christ in worship, preaching, teaching, and social functions; guided by the Lutheran Confessions. The member of this Evangelical Lutheran Church is an evangelist, a messenger of this good news.

Question: Why and What for the WEPP TEAM???

The WEPP TEAM or Witness Education and Personal Preparation Team, are brothers and sisters of St. Luke's who are committed to nurture and grow the "Spiritual Life" of St. Luke's members.

Our "Spiritual Life" is our inner life, the domain of the Spirit by which we make choices and decisions, which are acted out in our physical life, how we relate and who we relate to and with, what our values are, and how we are concerned about our neighbours' spiritual and physical well-being.

The health and wellness of our Christian Faith Life is dependent on our personal relationship with our Lord and Saviour Jesus, the Christ.

A Biblical Foundation

There are many biblical examples about how this personal relationship with Christ is established and acted out. Our reference here comes from the *first chapter of the Gospel of John:*

John the Baptist testified to his disciples that he was given to know "by the One who sent me to baptize with water that the one on whom I see the Spirit descend and remain is the Son of God."

The next day when John, with his disciples, saw Jesus walking, he pointed to him and proclaimed him "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world". Andrew and another of John's disciples who followed Jesus were invited to come and stay with him that day. We are not told what happened that day to Andrew, but we are told that he was so deeply touched by Jesus to be convinced that he was the Messiah, the Christ.

And now, at verse 40 of the 1st Chapter of John begins the process of personal witnessing:

The first thing Andrew does is to go and find his brother Simon to tell him that they have found the Messiah, the Christ and he brought him to Jesus, and Jesus named him 'Peter'.

The next day Jesus finds Philip and calls him to follow him, and Philip finds the doubtful Nathaniel who never the less accepts Philip's invitation to "come and see". Nathaniel, together with Andrew, Peter and Philip became faithful disciples of their Lord Jesus Christ.

The whole process of entering into relationship with Jesus began and begins with our Lord's invitation to "Come and See!" Lives are changed and faith grows and matures as our Lord becomes personal and important to those who answer his call.

A congregation which claims to be spiritually healthy will demonstrate its need for growing ever closer to Jesus and for following his ways as much or more than it demonstrates its need for a well maintained building, orderly and uplifting worship, outreach and social functions.

This is where the WEPP Team enters the picture. The team has chosen for itself the following Mission Statement:

"To equip the saints of St Luke's for the Ministry of Witness through providing growth opportunities such as Prayer and Study groups, Bible Studies and Workshops, as well as having Guest Speakers."

Right up front it should be noted that teaching one method of witnessing is not the team's focus, because each of us has our own personal way in how we relate with others. Teaching one method to meet all needs severely compresses the natural way of relating to another, which is the foundation for honest and genuine witnessing, telling our Christ story.

This is where the commitment to "Witness Education" comes in which has at its foundation our Lord's invitation to "Come and See", spent time with him, and the commitment by the disciples to do the "come and see we have found the Messiah, the Christ." The growth activities listed will lead any participant into a closer relationship and possibly

deeper commitment to being Christ's disciples who proclaim His love, grace and mercy in very personal ways; and with every participant in any of those ventures the 'spiritual life of the congregation deepens and matures because when we come and seek to be closer to Jesus, the Holy Spirit does wonderful work within that relationship.

And so it is that the WEPP Team invites every member of St. Luke's to come and see, to come and spend time with Jesus in the study of his Word and to discover how our Lord nurtures and deepens our faith life and actions. COME AND SEE!!!
