The Hardest Part – Hurt We Carry, Hope We Find

Besides Advent, Lent is my favourite church season. You may find that weird. Don't we focus on Jesus' pain and our sorrows during this time? Yes, you are right! But life is this strange, tender mix, isn't it? Joy and sorrow. Love and loss. Big wins and even bigger failures. We cling tightly to the beautiful moments in our lives, but then the phone rings, a diagnosis drops, or some creeping ache reminds us that everything is so much more fragile than we would like to admit. Life can be too much. And Lent is the season where we sit in that heaviness.

For 40 days, we stop pretending things will suddenly get better and face the truth: life is fragile, and so are we. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, when we hear the words no one really wants to say out loud: you are dust, and to dust you shall return. It is not exactly the kind of thing you would embroider on a pillow, but it's a truth we need. Lent invites us to stop pretending we can hold it all together and instead sit with the weight of what we carry—the grief, the regrets, the messes we can't untangle, no matter how much we try. Here's the hardest part: to be human is to carry the weight of our own mortality.

We love the joy and triumph of Easter morning, but first, we have to sit with Good Friday, when God is on the losing team. Jesus, who we look to for hope and healing, suffers and dies. His pain is real, just like ours. We cannot rush past it. We cannot skip to the good part, because it is through the deepest hurt that we begin to understand what it means to be fully human, fully broken. In The Hardest Part: Hurt We Carry, Hope We Find, we'll walk through these paradoxes together using material from Kate Bowler, a Professor for Religious History, New York Times Bestselling Author, and award-winning podcast host from Manitoba. Not to be devastated, but to find hope.

We will look at the hardest parts of being human heartbreak, emptiness, shame, and longing—and acknowledge the weight of it. We will explore scripture to remind us that grace has a way of sneaking in, even when life feels impossible (kind of like finding your phone after you've torn the house apart for the fifth time). So, let us do this hard part together. Let us sit with the ache and the fragile parts we would rather avoid, and trust that hope is somewhere nearby, waiting for us to notice. Because when we stay with the hard part, something else happens: the good part begins to unfold, slowly but surely.

I'm looking forward to going with you on this journey through Lent, exploring new pathways, acknowledging the hard parts, and trusting that God is along with us on the way.

Summer Camp @ Lake Huron

This year St. Luke's will join the Summer Lutheran Youth Camp (SLYC) at Camp Kintail located on the shores of Lake Huron in Goderich.

The Camp runs from August 25 to August 29. Costs for the week per camper are \$725, but ... St. Luke's council pledged to support us and we will do some fundraising, so that the costs are down to \$125 per camper. Youth entering Grades 6 to 12 in fall are welcome to join. High School students are welcome to participate as camp counselors (applications due beginning of March), which comes in handy if youth still need to do their community hours. Some advance training will be offered. This is not a confirmation camp. The focus is on having fun in a welcoming and inclusive environment. Do You Know Your God? An Invitation to Bible Study

How many people have read the entire New Testament? How much smaller does that number become if we were to include reading the Old Testament? It leads one wanting to ask, 'do you even know your God'?

Now if someone were to come up to you, and ask these scripture related questions, how would you respond? Would you even have an answer? I ask because these are questions which I also wrestled with before:

- If Jesus is God, why does He shout, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me" when He's hanging on the cross (Matthew 27:46)?
- When Christ says, "Why do you call Me good? No one *is* good but One, *that is*, God" (Mark 10:18)? Is He saying He's not good or not God?
- When Jesus was tempted by the devil, does that mean Satan tempted God? Can God be tempted?
- Why does Jesus say only the Father knows the hour? If He's God, shouldn't He know the hour?
- Jesus says, "Do not think I have come to bring peace on earth. I did not come to bring peace but a sword" (Matthew 10:34-36). So, is Jesus not really about peace?

So, I ask again, do you really know who this God that you worship is?

Matthew 7:21-23 (NKJV)

²¹ "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. ²² Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?' ²³ And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!' I invite, and implore you, all to join us in Bible study. Learn with us, as we seek to answer these questions, and deepen our relationship with the Lord. Feel free to join any of these dates, or more than one if you desire, and bring any and all questions you may have. Our God can withstand any questioning, and God willing, we can provide answers (or find them together). I hope to see you all.
